IT'S TIME TO STRIKE

UNISON members across the country have spoken. With the employers still not willing to negotiate we will take our first day of strike action on 10th of July.

We know why we are taking action. We have read all the facts and figures about our wages. How the pay freeze was a cut. How 1% is a pay cut.

More importantly we have lived it. All of us getting poorer every year. More of us claiming more benefits to make ends meet. More of us having to make sacrifices while the rich get richer.

All these sacrifices made in the name of austerity. A policy that has not fixed our economy. A policy that is Tory ideology, no matter what the financial situation.

The current offer is not fair. In any way. The Local Government Association and the Tories will talk big about offering us the living wage. Don't be fooled. Many branches, like ours, weren't willing to wait for the LGA to offer this to us. We have gone out and won it for ourselves and now they have the cheek to offer us what is already ours.

We are done waiting for a better offer. It isn't going to come without action and on July 10th we will take that action.

The Government will oppose us. The press If we all stand together we can win.

On legal advice UNISON did not ballot some employers where there was any doubt as to whether they were party to the dispute. The Tory laws were changed recently which makes it easier for employers to challenge ballots to prevent action and for every employer to claim up to £300,000 from a union.

However UNISON is reviewing contracts and where possible more employers will be balloted for the next round of strike action.

will oppose us. But we have something more important. We have each other. Other UNISON members across the country, our friends and colleagues that we work with every day. We have the unions that are balloting on this pay claim as well - GMB and Unite. We have other unions facing different disputes who may take action on the same day.


We also believe that our service users and the wider public will support us. They are suffering under Tory austerity too.

One day of action may not be enough. We may have to take more, hopefully joined by our members in the NHS. The most important message is this. We have a weak Government. We have a valid claim. History teaches us that Tories never give anything to working people without a fight.

YOUR GUIDE TO STRIKING

We know not everyone has taken industrial action before and may need some advice. So here's a guide to what you should do on 10th July.

Striking

Obviously, don't go to work or do your job, but you also shouldn't take leave, flex time or TOIL. If you do, it will be recorded as though you have worked. That will weaken the strike and our bargaining position. Remember to ask anyone who is working not to do your work while you are on strike.

We do make some very rare exemptions to strikes. For instance if you deliver 'life and limb' services or if you are pregnant or in your last year before retirement. If you think this may apply to you, please do contact the branch. Don't assume.

Picketing

Sad to say there will be a few people who will work on that day. We need to be there to ask them to join the strike and join UNISON. It is always worth reminding them that they can join UNISON immediately, even on the picket line, and they can strike and be protected by legislation and the union.

It can be upsetting when colleagues and friends cross a picket line but remember, there are strict laws on picketing so be polite.

We need to make sure every workplace is picketed. You'd be surprised how far some people will travel to avoid a picket line. If you work in a busy building that you know will be heavily picketed, don't stay at home. If you want to help picket your workplace, please contact the Branch on **0161 254 7500**.

Money

These are tough times. If being on strike will cause you genuine financial hardship don't

worry or feel pressured to go into work. Get in touch, we have a hardship fund set aside for these situations.

It's by taking strike action that we can improve pay for all.

Don't worry

If someone tries to force you to work, if someone threatens you or anything happens to make you feel uncomfortable then we want to know about it. You have a legal right to strike and we will not stand for our members being harassed. Like unions have always said: an injury to one is an injury to all.

Pre-strike Activities

As part of our pre-strike preparation the Branch is organising a series of meetings for members who wish to join a workplace picket and we strongly encourage you to attend one if you can.

All the meetings will be held in the Branch Office at Room 321 in the Town Hall and last no longer than an hour. Dates and start times are below:

- Friday 4th July 4.30pm
- Monday 7th July 12.30pm
- Wednesday 9th July 12.30pm
- Wednesday 9th July 4.30pm

Picketing will begin from 6.30am and those who picket will receive an allowance of $\pounds 20$ to cover their expenses for the day.
